1) Aims

This policy aims to clarify how TDPC will allocate PE and Sports Premium Funding in the context of Government policy.

2) Statutory Guidance

As a legacy of the 2012 Olympic games, the government provides additional PE and Sport funding to sustain and improve the provision for physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

As Taunton Deane Partnership College has less than 16 primary aged pupils on roll at any one time, the level of funding is £1000 per pupil (2023/24).

3) Identification of Pupils

As a PRU, TDPC only receives pupil premium for the sole registered pupils; although some dual registered pupils may be eligible for PE and Sports premium, this is paid to their mainstream school. Funding is calculated at census points and is paid to us direct from the local authority based on the number of sole registered primary pupils on role at that time.

As part of our rational as a PRU we use all of our PE and Sports funding for curriculum enrichment, specifically towards equipment for sport and outdoor education. This includes equipment for on-site sport/activities such as football, basketball, forest school activities. Off site equipment we use includes, mountain bikes, canoes/kayaks, climbing equipment.

4) Monitoring of Funding

A report is completed each year on the use of funding and includes:

- The amount of PE and Sport funding in the current year
- Details of how the previous year's funding was spent
- The impact of that spend on the engagement of pupils in physical activities
